Course Description: The purpose of this course is for students to grow in their knowledge of the Scriptures and in particular the book of Jonah. Each lesson looks at Jonah from a literary, exegetical and practical perspective. The book of Jonah is a highly compact literary unit, using parallels and chiasm throughout. Understanding the literary style is an important aid to correctly understand the message of the book. The book of Jonah develops several important biblical themes including Israel's responsibility to the nations, compassion, obedience, chastening, repentance, and restoration..
